Christmas Truce: a history lesson

The **Christmas truce** was a series of widespread, unofficial ceasefires that took place along the Western Front around Christmas 1914, during World War I. Through the week leading up to Christmas, parties of German and British soldiers began to exchange seasonal greetings and songs between their trenches; on occasion, the tension was reduced to the point that individuals would walk across to talk to their opposite numbers bearing gifts. On Christmas Eve and Christmas Day many soldiers from both sides independently ventured into "No Man's Land' where they mingled, exchanging food and souvenirs. Several meetings ended in carol-singing.

The truce is seen as a symbolic moment of peace and humanity amidst one of the most violent events of modern history.

Applying Bible Principles

"Strategic planning" is a twoword term that can best be described as a "buzz word." It's in vogue. It's trendy for businesses (and churches) to talk about and engage in strategic planning.

Frequently, when quizzed about why they should engage in strategic planning, business

owners and mangers will respond with a host of reasons and yet miss the basic benefit that comes from planning: Businesses which plan are more profitable than those which do

not. In other words, those who aim at something are more likely to hit it than those who aim at nothing.

Similarly, when it comes to giving, Christians are to develop a "strategic plan." We are instructed to set aside funds systematically, regularly, for support of the Lord's work. In that way, when we come to worship each week, we'll be

prepared to give. We will have "planned" our giving under the divine leadership of the Holy Spirit. Then, by giving that which we have set aside, we will put our plan to work as the offering is received.

Yes, the Holy Spirit can and sometimes does lead us to give gifts in a spontaneous manner without planning. But as a rule,

> s p o n t a n e o u s, u n p l a n n e d giving is the exception. Most of the time, God wants His people to give systematically and to respond to His direction in their lives

by careful planning.

Speaking of consistent givers (the kind who generally plan their giving), Randy Alcorn described them as the "backbone of the church." Such people do not miss giving to the Lord's work, even when they are unable to attend. Just because they are not physically present when the offering plate is passed does not mean that they skip a Sunday or

two in supporting the life and ministry of the church.

Be ready to give as the Spirit of God leads, even on a moment's notice. Be ready to give when a special need arises. But most of all, develop a "strategic plan" to give by seeking God's direction concerning your giving and by aside funds in putting preparation for giving. Then "work your plan" by giving those funds as you gather at Northwest United Methodist Church with other Christians each Lord's Day. And when you can't be present for worship, plan carefully to be sure that your giving follows your plan. Remember, the work and ministry of Northwest United Methodist Church go on week after week, even when you are unable to be present.

It is our Christmas wish for each family that call Northwest their church home to provide Christmas dinner for a family of 4 with the following items. Also prayerfully consider joining us on Sunday December 22 after Sunday School to pass out the meal bags at Laurel Woods Apartments.

Suggested Contents of the Christmas Bags:
Canned ham, or Turkey or gift card to cover cost of meat
Box of stuffing
2 cans green beans or any vegetable
1 Can or jar of gray
Instant Potatoes or large can of sweet potatoes
Dessert (Christmas Cookies, pickup pie on way to church on 22nd, baking mix that just takes water.

Project Warm: Volunteer opportunities and Donations

Did you know that during the winter of 2012-2013 that no man died on the streets of South Bend? Project Warm was opened December 2011 with the hope that no man would die on the streets of South Bend because he did not have a place to get out of the cold. Project WARM is a Christ centered outreach providing overnight weather protection during the coldest times of the year for the South Bend homeless population. The aim of this project is to provide food and shelter as we bring the transforming power of the Gospel to men who live on the streets. This ministry happens through the hospitality and love shown via the food, fellowship and message that they receive, all as God guides and provides. Project Warm weather amnesty shelter will be open every night from 12/1-3/31. 8pm to 7am, at Hope Ministries on Michigan Street in South Bend.

Volunteers opportunities are available every evening. At least three volunteers are need. There will be Three paid staff each evening as well. One volunteer is to provide a snack (this is different from last year wear a meal was provided). The Men will eat at Hope before coming to the shelter. Volunteers will arrive at 7:45 and pray before the men come in at 8pm, the will say a prayer for the snack, one volunteer will do a short devotion, clean up and leave at 9pm. Staff can escort you to your car if needed.
